



Dear Friends,

Please pray for a young man named YangDe. I have known him for over ten years. Recently, the Lord gave me the opportunity to challenge him in his walk with Christ, particularly in the area of discipleship. Since then, he has begun taking steps forward, and I am encouraged by his response.

“Make His deeds known among his people”

I have also had several opportunities to present the Gospel to a young man named Andrew. We are now meeting weekly for Bible study. These are good developments at this stage in the new church plant. In addition, we have built a strong relationship with our pagan neighbors. We often “borrow” from one another, not out of necessity, but as a cultural expression of trust and friendship here in Taiwan. It has opened doors and reflects a growing connection with them.

However, we must place these developments on hold for a time. On March 13, we returned to the United States to be with my dad, who is now under hospice care. This was not unexpected, but the time has come to care for him in this way. My dad, Pastor Tom Walz, is still the founding pastor of our home church. Only eternity will reveal the full impact of his life and ministry. It is an honor to care for him as he prepares to enter glory.

While we are home, I will be preaching regularly at our home church and taking on additional ministry responsibilities. Please pray that the Lord will open doors for soul-winning and for calling people into full-time service. The Lord has been faithful to answer this prayer over the years.

The work in Taiwan continues. The churches we have turned over are faithfully preaching the Gospel and are seeing people saved and baptized. Pastor Sam is currently seeking to purchase property. We have approximately \$100,000 already given toward this need, though the total cost will likely be closer to \$400,000. While this is a significant amount, property in Taiwan requires these one-time investments and greatly strengthens the long-term stability of the ministry. Pastor Sam is currently paying rent for two church plants while taking a smaller salary, so this would relieve a major burden for him and his family.

Looking ahead, we are planning a missions trip for Spring 2027. Our goal is to host a marriage retreat for our Taiwanese pastors and their families. We would like to invite a supporting church to come alongside us for a week to help teach sessions and lead breakout groups. The trip will also include opportunities to assist with evangelistic dinners in three different cities.

Finally, we are praying about a young lady who may return with us to Taiwan for the next school year to assist with homeschooling our children. We have had a very positive experience using Abeka this past year. This opportunity would include a monthly salary, the chance to learn Chinese to an intermediate level, and opportunities to build relationships with Taiwanese women and invite them to church.
