We had a 7 a.m. flight to Charlotte, North Carolina, and a book signing at the Billy Graham Library at 1 p.m.! Our flight was on time, our rental car was ready, and we made it with time to spare.

The folks at the library were so kind and gracious. They had prepared delicious food for us, and these precious servants of the Lord spoiled us. I signed numerous copies of my autobiography, *Born on the Fifth of July*. Afterward, we were given a special tour of the library. What an amazing place!

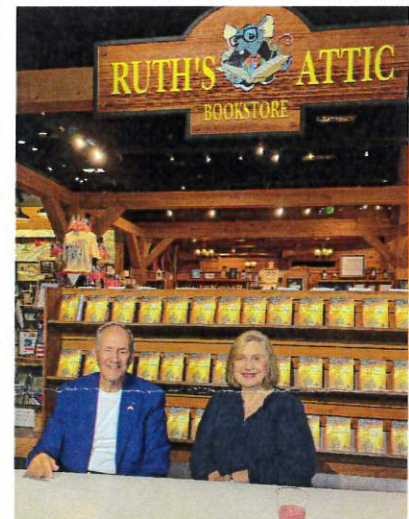

Book Signing at the Billy Graham Library at Ruth's Attic, named after his late wife.

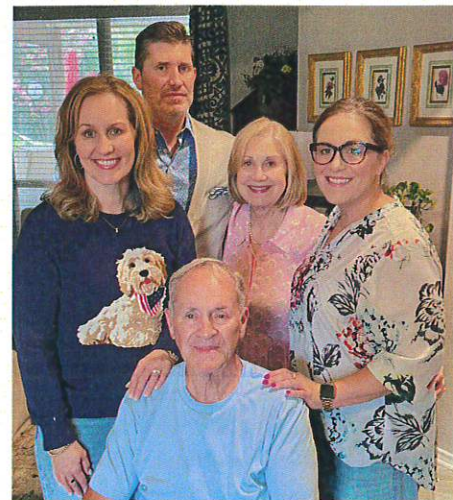
